The Championship/open shows will all hold qualifiers in certain classes for Amateur Showing Society Summer Championships and RB Equestrian Chiltern and Thames Championships.

Club Rules

All entries and admissions are at the discretion of the committee.

1. Most classes run a points championship. Points will be awarded on a 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 basis for the first 6 places and will be decided over all the club shows. Points will count with the same combination only.
2. Neither the landowner nor the riding club accept any responsibility for the loss or damage to any horse, vehicle, persons or any other property arising from the show.
3. The committee reserve the right to cancel, change or adjust any of the classes at any of the shows without giving notice.
4. Correct attire must be worn at all times and long sleeves are compulsory in all jumping classes.
5. Hard hats to the standard PAS015 must be worn and fastened when mounted. Hard hats must also be worn by all competitors under 14yrs old in all in-hand classes. Suitable small heeled footwear must also be worn.
6. Body Protectors are compulsory for Jump Star.
7. Outside assistance to competitors in any class will result in the competitor being eliminated. (This does not apply to the first 2 jumping classes in ring 1 or the clear round ring)
8. Lean rein entries must be led at all times over all fences, non-lead rein entries must not be led at any time.
9. It is the competitors' responsibility to present themselves at the correct time in the correct ring for their class.
10. No Horse or pony maybe entered competitively more than once in any one class.
11. Registered mountain and Moorland entries must be shown natural. Part-breds may be shown plaited.
12. Entire males over the age of 1yrs old must be bitted and under control at all times. They must not be shown by children under the age of 14 yrs old.
13. No horse or pony under 4yrs of age to be jumped anywhere on the show field.
14. Competitors age as of 1/01/2016
15. The use of foul or abusive language will not be tolerated.
16. No cantering outside rings.
17. In jumping classes all fence heights are approximate.
18. Competitors must enter and leave the ring at walk.
19. Rubbish must not be left on field.
20. No refunds for entries on the day.
21. All dogs to be kept on the lead.
22. All droppings to be taken home.

Signing of the entry form will be considered acceptance of these rules

Royal London Qualifiers

First, second and third placed horses/ponies not already qualified in eligible classes will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at the Royal London Show in 2016. Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Royal London Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the International Showing Society within 28 days of the qualifying show. Ring 3

In-Hand Showing to commence at 10am

Class 20: Youngstock * # ~

3 years and under.

Class 21: Veterans * # ~

15 years and over.

Class 22: Best Conditioned * #

Plaited and unplaited.

Class 23: Coloured-odd and unusual * # ~

Skewbald, piebald, tricolour, palominos, spots, roans, creams, duns, appaloosas.

Class 24: Best Child Handler * # ~

Child to be under 10 yrs on 1/01/16- Mares and Geldings only.

Class 25: Best Child Handler * # ~

Child to be under 14 yrs on 1/01/16 but over 10 yrs. - Mares and Geldings only.

Class 26: Mountain and Moorland – Registered * # ~

May be split between large and small breeds.

Class 27: Mountain and Moorland- un-registered and part-breeds * # ~

Part breeds maybe plaited. - may be split between large and small breeds.

Championship: All 1st and 2nd placed competitors to qualify from classes 20-27

Ring 1

Show Jumping to commence at 10.45am

Class 1: Teenie jumping

Approximately 25- 30 cm. Split into lead rein/non-lead rein. Under 12 years.

Class 2: Mini Jumping

Approximately 40cm. Split into lead rein/non-lead rein. Under 12 years.

Class 3: Open Jumping

Approximately 40 – 50cm.

Class 4: Pre–Novice Jumping *

Approximately 55cm. Split between over 18's and under 18's.

Class 5: Mini Individual *

Approximately 65cm. 2 rounds.

Class 6: Novice Individual *

Approximately 75cm. 2 rounds.

Class 7: Small Open Individual *

Approximately 85cm. 2 rounds.

Rider and Horse Combinations cannot enter more than 2 consecutive classes. Heights for classes 5-7 will not be under the stated height to comply with CTR show jumping rules.

Clear Round Open all day. To commence at 10am starting at 25cm. Competitors may put the jumps to the height they require if not busy.

Entry is £3 or £5 for two rounds (same horse and rider combination). Raffle tickets to be bought at the entry tent.

Ring 2

Ridden Showing to commence at 10am

Class 8: Best Turned out * #

May be split between plaited or unplaited. Open to all.

Class 9: Lead Rein * # ~

Children 9yrs and under on 1/01/16 - ponies not to exceed 122cm (12hh)

Class 10: First Year First Ridden * #

For children just coming off the lead rein. Judge will expect a small display of walk and trot only. Ponies not to exceed 138cm (13.2hh) (*ponies 12.2hh and under qualify for ASS*)

Competitors entering class 10 may not enter 11.

Class 11: First Ridden * #

For children younger than 11yrs on 1/01/16. Ponies must not exceed 128cm (12.2hh). (*Ponies over 128cm (12.2hh) do not qualify for CTR or ASS*).

Championship: All 1st and 2nd placed competitors to qualify from classes 8 - 11.

Class 12: Mountain and Moorland registered * # ~

Maybe split into small and large and small breeds. (*LR do not qualify for CTR but may qualify for ASS*).

Class 13: Mountain and Moorland unregistered and part-breeds * # ~

Maybe split into small and large breeds. (*LR do not qualify for CTR but may qualify for ASS*).

Class 14: Ridden cob/maxi-cob * # ~

For horses over 148cm (14.2hh). May be shown hogged, plaited, unplaited.

Class 15: Ridden Coloured * # ~

Odd and unusual- skewbald, piebald, tricolour, palominos, spots, roans, creams, duns, appaloosas.

Class 16: Ridden Veteran * # ~

For horses and ponies aged 15 years and over (*LR do not qualify for CTR*).

Class 17: Novice Ridden *

Maybe split between horses and ponies. For novice riders who have never won a showing class before 1st January 2016. (*LR cannot enter this class*).

Class 18 – Show Hunter ~

Open to horses and ponies.

Class 19 – Foreign Breeds * ~

Open to Andalucians, Lusitanos, Lippizaners, Quarter Horses, Saddlebreds, Morgans, Paints, Paso Fino, Knabstruppers, Halflinger, Mustangs, Appaloosas (and any other foreign breed that are not warmblood, british breeds, British natives, No Arabs)

Championship: All 1st and 2nd place competitors to qualify from classes 12 – 19
